The Ferndale School District takes bullying very seriously and has a zero-tolerance policy. In order to protect our students from bullying, it is important that we partner with families to properly identify bullying and work together to come up with solutions that stop the bullying behavior and support all students involved.

Board Policy 3207

What is bullying?

Bullying is defined as negative actions which are intentional, repeated, and have a power imbalance.

Types of bullying

Bullying is any intentional electronic, written, verbal, or physical action which results in one or more of the following:

- Physically or emotionally harms a student or damages the student's property
- Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's education
- Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating or threatening educational environment
- Has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school

What do we do at school to prevent bullying?

- Yearly training for all staff on how to respond to reports of bullying.
- Specifically designed anti-bullying lessons taught by the school counselor to all classes.
- Reinforcing positive behaviors through school-wide positive behavior support initiatives.
- Teach and re-teach social skills, with an emphasis on areas of problem solving and empathy.
- Foster an environment of belonging.

What do we do if a student reports bullying?

All suspected bullying incidents are reported to the principal, dean, and/or school counselor, who then will do an investigation. If the incident is confirmed to be a case of bullying, a Bullying Incident Form will be used to document and guide how we move forward (see back of this page). It is important to note that not all incidents will result in a confirmed case of bullying. However, even if an incident is not confirmed to be bullying, it may still result in consequences and/or interventions for those involved.

What can I do at home to help?

Families play a vital role in helping to identify and eliminate bullying. Here are some things you can do:

- Talk to your student about trusted adults at school who they can go to when/if they need help.
- Stay in contact with the school and with teachers we are here to help and want to have a relationship with our families.
- Discuss ways that your student can show kindness, empathy, and compassion to others.
- Connect with your student about their day and identify successes and challenges together.
- Talk to your student about their social media accounts and usage.
